Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges (ACCSC) Graduation and Employment Rate Calculation Methodology

All Employment rates disclosed were reported to ACCSC in the 2025 annual report. The Employment rates for schools accredited by ACCSC are based on the outcomes of students that started during a specified period time. This period of time calculation is based on the program length, in months, for completion within the maximum time period (1.5 times the normal program length) plus 3 months to find employment. Graduates are considered unavailable for employment for the following reasons: death, incarceration, active military service deployment, the onset of a medical condition that prevents employment, or international students who have returned to their country of origin. These disclosed employment rates reflect historical outcomes of graduate employment and should not be relied on by anyone as an implicit or explicit representation or promise of future employability for any graduate. The rates are reported annually in October and include all students who started their program of study during the reporting period.
